Being a Friend to the Future

"There are generations yet unborn whose very lives will be shifted and shaped by the moves you make and the actions you take today. And tomorrow. And the next day. And the next." This quote is what Laurel County businessman Garry Conley strives to live by each and every day.

Mr. Conley is owner of Minuteman Press in London, he can frequently be seen at community events or volunteering with the London-Laurel Chamber or the London Rotary Club. Yet, his volunteer passion often leads him into classrooms throughout the Laurel County School system. A few years ago Mr. Conley began to volunteer at South Laurel High School in a program called Junior Achievement Career Success. A 7 week program where community volunteers come to a high school classroom once a week for 45 minutes and teach youth the skills and tools needed to work in today's 21st century workforce while also being a mentor.

During the 7 week course the volunteers are provided with curriculum material that focuses on the 4C's: critical thinking, communication, collaboration and creativity. Mr. Conley describes the curriculum as "amazing," adding that it "allows for personal connection and reflection." Students each session are tasked with different scenarios and problems that have to be finished individually or as a group. Mr. Conley said he is often "amazed" at the talent of the youth.

In addition to the 4C's the curriculum puts emphasis on skills and tools involving science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) related industries. Students learn about employment in those industries, including different career opportunities and job outlook. "Junior Achievement prepares students for entering a 21st Century workforce," said Mr. Conley.

Mr. Conley said he wanted to be a positive influence and be part of the "help pick them up crowd," instead of being negative. He explained that youth today are growing up in a very different environment than the childhood he experienced. He believes youth today need "somebody in their corner and many don't have anyone."

The Laurel County School system is fortunate to have volunteers like Mr. Conley throughout the entire school system who volunteer and invest their time in today's youth. Students need role models and mentors within their community to inspire and guide them to be ready to be productive adults within their community.

The students who have been a part of the Junior Achievement Career Success program with Mr. Conley not only gained insight into running a business, but also gained a friend who is cheering them on. Are you going to be cheerleader for your future leaders? If you are a business owner or a business and interested in volunteering with youth through the school system there are numerous opportunities including Junior Achievement, the Work Ethic Seal Program, career panels and many other opportunities.
