CENTER FOR INNOVATION LABS PROVIDE SPECIALIZED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES



Students in the Allied Health Science (AHS) program and the Industrial Maintenance Technology (IMT) program at the CFI are learning valuable skills in the Medical Science Lab and the Welding Lab, respectively.

Students are learning comparative anatomy and physiology in the medical science lab. They recently participated in the dissection of a fetal pig specimen to learn organ systems identification and physiological function.

Tammy Jones, MSN, RN, and MNA program coordinator spoke of the role that kinesthetic learning plays in reinforcing lecture and theory content from the classroom and the ability to apply that knowledge in clinical practicum and lab activities. "Our medical science lab is designed especially for enriched and specialized learning activities and we are so pleased to provide this opportunity for our students at the CFI", remarked Jones. "The AHS program provides outstanding education and training for our students and we have scores of students that have successfully transitioned to the workforce in varied healthcare settings, have earned professional credentials, and are also currently in college completing their advanced education for future career success" stated Dr. James M. Davis, CFI Principal.

Industrial Maintenance Technology (IMT) students are learning to utilize metal fabrication skills in the welding lab. In the Welding for Maintenance class these students learn three major fabrication processes such as MIG, TIG, and Stick welding.

Students also learn construction technology skills in the residential lab utilizing various saws, building supplies, hand tools, and power tools. "Our graduates of the IMT program are highly sought after for careers in advanced manufacturing by various major employers in the region", said Gary Karr, IMT program coordinator.

**SENATOR BRANDON STORM
SWORN IN TO OFFICE;
ANNOUNCES COMMITTEE MEMBERSHIP
FOR 2021 GENERAL ASSEMBLY**

The Senate Majority Caucus has announced the committee assignments for the 2021 Regular Session of the Kentucky General Assembly. Senator Brandon Storm (R-London), will serve as vice-Chairman of the Senate Standing Committee on Transportation and as chairman of the Enrollment Committee.

Senator Storm will also serve as a member of the Senate Standing Committees on Banking and Insurance; Economic Development, Tourism, and Labor; State and Local Government; and the Budget Review Subcommittee on Human Resources. Additionally, he will serve as a member of both the Child Welfare Oversight and Advisory as well as the Program Review and Investigations Statutory Committees.

“I’m grateful to officially be in Frankfort representing the 21st Senate District and am grateful for the trust placed in me by Senate Leadership to serve on these committees,” Said Senator Storm. “My first session as State Senator is certain to be unprecedented for a new member of the General Assembly, but I look forward to working with my colleagues to address the challenges our state is facing.”
